U.S./China: On Thursday, February 2, 2023, a Chinese weather balloon was blown off course and strayed in U.S. airspace. Following its discovery, U.S. officials stated that it was believed to be a spy balloon. Though China reassured that it was just a weather balloon that strayed off course, the U.S. still shot down the balloon off the coast of South Carolina after it was safe to do so.

Ukraine: On Friday, February 3, 2023, the Ukrainian government revealed a case they had been building on Yevgeny Prigozhin, the leading figure of the Russian mercenary group *Wagner*, which has been a Russian asset in the war. This was followed up by a statement that said "mercenaries (from the group) of all ranks would be held responsible."

U.S.: As of Friday, February 3, 2023, more than 320,000 people across Texas, Arkansas, and Mississippi were still without power after a record breaking ice storm. Along with the power outage and freezing temperatures, 11 people have died from the weather, most being from car crashes due to the icy roads.



### Author of the Week



This week's Author of the Week is American author, Veronica Roth. Veronica Roth was born August 19th, 1988

in New York. She grew up in Barrington, Illinois and began writing at an early age and she was an ardent, passionate, reader. She was a massive fan of Lois Lowry's works, especially *The Giver*. In high school, Veronica

Roth became an active Christian. This path to religion was a theme in her works. Before the young author graduated from Northwestern University, where she had studied creative writing, she wrote *Divergent*, the first installment in the science-fiction trilogy that people know and love today, during winter break her senior year. The book was sold to HarperCollins in 2010, shortly after she took the manuscript of the book to a writers conference in March. In 2011, it was sixth on the *New York Times* bestseller list. In 2012, *Insurgent* was released and took the


top spot on the very same list. The fans of the series grew and grew to the point that when the series finale, <u>Allegiant</u>, came out in 2013, it was the most-preordered book that HarperCollins had ever issued. The series was successful, having over 30 million copies sold by 2015. The series is about a girl named Beatrice Prior, and she was born in a world where there are factions, sections separated by virtue and values, that people are designated to

when they turn 16. Abnegation for selflessness, Candor for honesty, Dauntless for boldness, Amity for peacefulness, and Erudite for the intelligent. Beatrice fits in multiple of these, an oddity called a "divergent," and that is something that could get her killed if people learned of it. She leaves her current faction, Abnegation, and attempts to hide her deadly secret as she earns acceptance into her new one, Dauntless. All of the books in the series had film adaptations and she even made a side novel, *Four: A Divergent Collection*. Years after, Roth created more books not connected to the previous series. Those are *Carve the Mark*, *The Fates Divide*, *The End and Other* 

Beginnings: Stories from the Future, Chosen Ones, and Poster Girl.





#### **Black History Month**

For this installment of Sharp Moments, we will discuss what the month of February is known as, Black History Month. If you aren't aware, Black History Month is a month to recognize the African American citizens' roles in our society. This month is also known as African American History Month, and it has been celebrated since 1976. Not only America participates in this, other countries like Canada and the United Kingdom devote a month of the year to Black history.

The origin of Black History Month dates back to 1915, which was half a century (Fifty years) after the Thirteenth Amendment abolished slavery in 1865. As quoted from the United States Constitution, "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction." This says that slavery is not permitted unless it's punishment for a committed crime. Otherwise, a person cannot be forced to work except for if they are paid for their services, it'd be a job rather than forced labor. The September of 1915 was when the prominent minister Jesse E. Moorland and Harvard-trained historian Carter G. Woodson founded an organization that was devoted to researching and promoting achievements by African Americans and others of African descent. They called it the "Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (ASNLH)" (History.com). Present day, the name was changed to the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH). This organization sponsored national Negro History week in 1926, which they held on the second week of February because of the birthdays of Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln, who are important figures in American history. This inspired numerous schools and communities to host local celebrations of Black history.

Over the span of decades, city mayors began to issue annual proclamations to recognize "Negro History Week." Thanks to the civil rights movement and growing awareness of Black identity, "Negro History Week" became Black History Month by the late 1960s. In 1976, the thirty-eighth U.S. president, President Gerald Ford, officially recognized Black History Month. As stated by History.com, present day, "Black History Month is a time to honor the contributions and legacy of African Americans across U.S. history and society." Historic icons like Harriet Tubman, Malcolm X, Sojourner Truth, Marcus Garvey, Martin Luther King Jr., and Rosa Parks among so many others are recognized during this month.

The main theme of this month, the theme that has been designated to it since 1976 by the American presidents, is "Black Resistance." For so long, African American citizens faced horrible discrimination and historic opposition. This month was meant to explore that and celebrate their resistance in such awful times.
