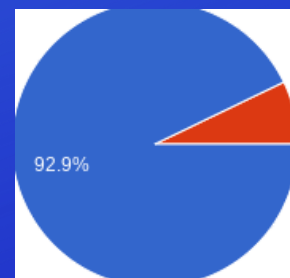

Muhammad Ali vs Mike Tyson

Who would win this fight in their prime, Muhammad Ali or Mike Tyson?

Mike Tyson

All throughout Mike Tyson's career, he was known for the explosive force behind his punches that had nearly every match ending in a KO (Knockout). Mike Tyson's record stood 58 fights, 50 clear wins, an astounding 44 knockouts, and only 6 losses. Mike Tyson was 18 when he had his debut match in Albany, New York, March 6, 1985. He had beaten his opponent, Hector Mercedes, in the first round via TKO (Total knockout). This led to Tyson having the nickname "Dynamite Kid" early in his career, referencing the astounding force behind his punches.

Once, Mike Tyson had even said "My power is discombobulatingly devastating. I could feel his muscle tissues collapse under my force." He has been known to be one of the most brutal and vicious competitors to ever enter the ring. Mike Tyson had been sent to jail in 1992 and was released in 1995. He had been seen and said to be working out nearly every day of his life in prison and when he came back to the ring, he was a completely different monster. In a fight after he left prison with fellow boxer Evander Holyfield, he had managed to get in close and bit Evander's ear clean off, leaving a horrific spectacle to be had when looking at Mike Tyson's undeniable power and near insane violence/brutality in the sport of boxing.

I believe that Mike Tyson, as an incredibly offensive and powerful boxer, would had a near complete chance of overpowering and defeating Muhammad Ali. Mike Tyson was an in-boxer (a boxer that would get up in close typically taking the offensive to compensate for a short wing span and lesser defensive and spacing abilities) which in some sense would give him a clear advantage if he could simply land even a body shot, let alone a shot to the head.

Muhammad Ali

As one of the best if not the best boxers in American history, Muhammad Ali was beloved and feared by all. His career started at age 18 by him winning a gold medal in the light heavyweight division at the 1960 Summer Olympics, and he later went professional that year. During his first official match, Ali won a six-round decision over Tunney Hunsaker, which would set the tone for the rest of his career. Throughout his entire career, Ali had 61 fights, only lost 5 of those matches, and compiled an impressive 37 knockouts.

Now, compared with Mike Tyson's 44 KOs, that doesn't seem very impressive, but Mike only had 58 fights and lost 6 of them. With those statistics they are evenly matched, but where things really matter is in their fighting styles. During his career, Ali had one famous catchphrase that could describe his fighting style: "Float like a butterfly, sting like a bee." Even though Ali was a heavyweight he used a style of boxing that used more speed, movement and quick reflexes, rather than power and aggression. While using this style, Ali wouldn't be giving people KOs, but rather wear them down throughout the match.

When put up against Mike's more aggressive/defensive style, it would be a spectacle of a fight to see these styles matched up against the other by very talented fighters. Even though Mike has more power behind his punches, I believe he would not be fast enough to take out Ali within his usual 4 round limit, which after that point his chances decrease even further. Even if he got a hit on Ali, Ali has taken many hits from some of the best boxers, like Frazier and Moore, and still fought on to win. Though, it's very likely Mike wouldn't be able to get close enough to Ali, who had a reach of 80 inches combined with his speed. Mike wouldn't be able to get enough hits on Ali and would most likely lose after a long 10-12 round match, ending with Ali winning.
