WORLD NEWS

Ukraine: Ukrainian special military units moved into the city of Kherson and raised the Ukrainian flag for the first time since March while crowds cheered. Following the seizure of the city, the government began to start rebuilding the region but did warn citizens that there was still a threat of Russian invasion, making Kherson a frontline in the Ukraine war.

G20 Summit: The G20 summit is a meeting with the world's top economic countries that discuss economic issues that could harm the global economy. The 2022 G20 summit will be held in Nusa Dua, Bali, Indonesia from November 15–16th.

Political Figures: In a conference today, President Joe Biden and his Chinese counterpart, Xi Jingping, both agreed that nuclear war should be avoided and that it should never occur.

Climate: China climate envoy Xie Zhenhua made a statement on Monday saying that Beijing would limit their global warming to 2 degrees celsius and that other countries should go for 1.5 degrees celsius, which is what the 2015 Paris Agreement said in similar language.

Author of the Week




For this installment of Author of the Week, the author chosen is French novelist, playwright, and essayist Albert Camus. Camus was born November 7th, November 7, 1913 in Mondovi, Algeria. Less than a year after his birth, Albert Camus' father was killed in World War I, during the First Battle of the Marne. Along with his mother and older brother, Lucien, he moved to a working-class district of Algiers, where the three lived with their grandmother and paralyzed uncle. In 1918, Camus entered primary school and was taught by an impressive teacher, Louis Germain, who aided Albert Camus in 1923 to win a scholarship to Algiers lycée (high school). There, Camus had a great interest in sports, which he participated in until 1930, when he suffered a severe tuberculosis attack that put an end to his sporting career. Throughout the 1930s, Albert Camus read many French classics, and he joined

the Algerian Communist Party. Also, he acted, wrote, adapted, and produced for the Théâtre du Travail. Two years before World War II, Camus had an apprenticeship with Alger-Républicain as a journalist. He served many positions as an editor in his years, and eventually became an important literary figure. In 1957, Camus received the Nobel Prize for Literature. He died January 4th, 1960 near Sens, France. Albert Camus' most famous works were *L'Étranger (The Stranger), La Peste (The Plague)*, and *La Chute (The Fall)*.



Review of Scythe

Being published on November 22, 2016, Scythe is the first in a series of books by Neal Shusterman. These books are part of the Arc of a Scythe series of books. Even though Scythe is the first in the series, I would argue it may be the best in the lot.

Scythe is set in the far future where the cloud has become so intelligent that it became the world's sole leader under the name Thunderhead. In this future, people can live forever and to stop overpopulation, the Scythedom was founded. The Scythedom is tasked with killing those they see fit to be killed. Those who are part of the Scythedom that do the killing are called Scythes. Scythes kill not in typical fashion, but one that is in their choosing. Scythes even have a special karate called Bokador. This Karate type has many subsections and categories to train in. Even a scythe's name is important as they could be any famous person from the Mortal Age. The Mortal Age is the age we are in now. After a period of time, a death by a Scythe became known as a gleaning. Overtime the Scythes have been corrupted and very few scythes are left with good intentions, whatever those may be for a bringer of death.

The story begins with Citra Terranova at home when a scythe wearing an ivory robe comes to their home, having apparently smelled the cooking food. Citra believes that he is there to kill either her or someone in their home, but instead he is there to glean their neighbor and he's waiting for them to return home. While the scythe waited, he introduced himself as Scythe Faraday. Then Rowan Damich is at school and a scythe has entered the school, Scythe Faraday. He is there to kill the star quarterback and Rowan holds the quarterback's hand through the whole thing. Scythe Faraday takes both Rowan and Citra into apprenticeship and they start training. When they attend the Fall Council, a scythe proposes the winner gleans the loser so they can forever remember the sacrifice and pain they went through to earn their ring. Rowan develops an interest in Citra and throws the competitions they have against each other. While this is happening, Faraday invokes suicide so he can try to save Rowan and Citra. Instead of halting the process, they hand them off to different scythes. Citra went to Scythe Curie and Rowan went to Scythe Goddard. Rowan kills Goddard because of his cursed ways and Citra wins the competition for the scythe ring. Citra assists Rowan in his escape when the reader finds out Scythe Faraday was alive and he was just in hiding.
