

Author of the Week

For this week's author, we have chosen Earnest Hemingway. Earnest Miller Hemingway was born on July 21, 1899, and died July 2, 1961. He grew up in suburban Chicago. He was educated in a public school and began to write in high school. He spent most summers with his family in Michigan. Hemingway graduated in 1917 from Walloon High School at the age of seventeen. He was an ambulance driver in World War 1. He was injured in the war and found the love of his life at the hospital, a Red Cross nurse, Agnes Von Kurowsky. He was a novelist and a short story writer. Some of the books he wrote were *The Sun Also Rises, The Old Man and the Sea, A Farewell to Arms,* and *For Whom the Bell Tolls.* He won a Nobel Prize for Literature in 1945 and he also won the Pulitzer Prize for fiction.
